



George Eichenberg has worked in private security, public law enforcement, and juvenile corrections during 15 years of criminal justice field work in three states. He holds a baccalaureate in criminal justice from the University of Texas at Tyler and master's of criminal justice management and Ph.D. Criminal Justice, both from Sam Houston State.

His first 'real' academic job was at Wayne State College of Wayne, Nebraska where he taught for six years before returning to Texas in 2001 to teach at the Killeen campus of Tarleton State University. In 2005 he was transferred to Tarleton's main campus in Stephenville where he acted as criminal justice program director until 2008. He currently serves as chair of Tarleton's Institutional Review Board for Human Subjects and on several other university committees. He is lead advisor to the Criminal Justice Association and Rifle Team and is a certified firearms instructor and board member of the North Texas National Rifle Association Committee. His scholarly activities include criminal justice ethics, social control, and religiously based political extremism.
