



Dr. George Day was employed as a Juvenile Correctional Officer from 1998 to 2004 and a Program Specialist from 2004-2006 for the Texas Youth Commission (TYC). While employed with TYC he earned a Bachelor of Science (2004) and a Master of Science (2006) in Criminal Justice from Tarleton State University.
