



Dr. Thomas J. Holt is an Associate Professor in the School of Criminal Justice at Michigan State University specializing in cybercrime, policing, and policy. He received his Ph. D. in Criminology and Criminal Justice from the University of Missouri-Saint Louis in 2005. He has published extensively on cybercrime and cyberterror with over 50 peer-reviewed articles in outlets such as *British Journal of Criminology*, *Crime and Delinquency*, *Sexual Abuse*, *Journal of Criminal Justice*, *Terrorism and Political Violence*, and *Deviant Behavior*. He has published multiple books, including *Cybercrime and Digital Forensics: An Introduction* (2016, Routledge), and *Policing Cybercrime and Cyberterror* (2015, Carolina Academic Press). He has also received multiple grants from the National Institute of Justice and the National Science Foundation to examine the social and technical drivers of malware writers, data thieves, and hackers using on-line data. He has also given multiple presentations on cybercrime and security at academic and professional conferences around the world.
